## *Straight from the Lyon's Mouth*

As you know, LVA recycles paper, glass, plastic, and cardboard – but what about things like batteries and printer ink cartridges?

Luckily, there is a resource that lists area locations for recycling such toxic items, among other useful information: <http://virginia.earth911.org/usa/master.asp?newpostal=22201>

According to this Web site, both Staples and RadioShack stores recycle NiCad batteries, as well as rechargeable batteries. Staples stores also accept used ink and toner cartridges for recycling.

In addition, Arlington's Water Pollution Control Plant accepts a great variety of hazardous materials at their drop-off site, including computers, monitors (for a small fee), cell phones, and so on. The household waste entrance is at 3155 S. Fern Street, at the intersection of S. Fern Street and S. Glebe Road. Per the plant's Web site, <http://www.arlingtonva.us/Departments/EnvironmentalServices/wpcp/EnvironmentalServicesWpcpHouseholdHazMat.aspx>, "Weekday hours of operation are by appointment only. Call (703) 228-6832 during business hours to schedule an appointment. . . . Weekend business hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Saturdays."

An appointment is not required to drop off items on Saturdays, but the plant encourages phoning in advance.
